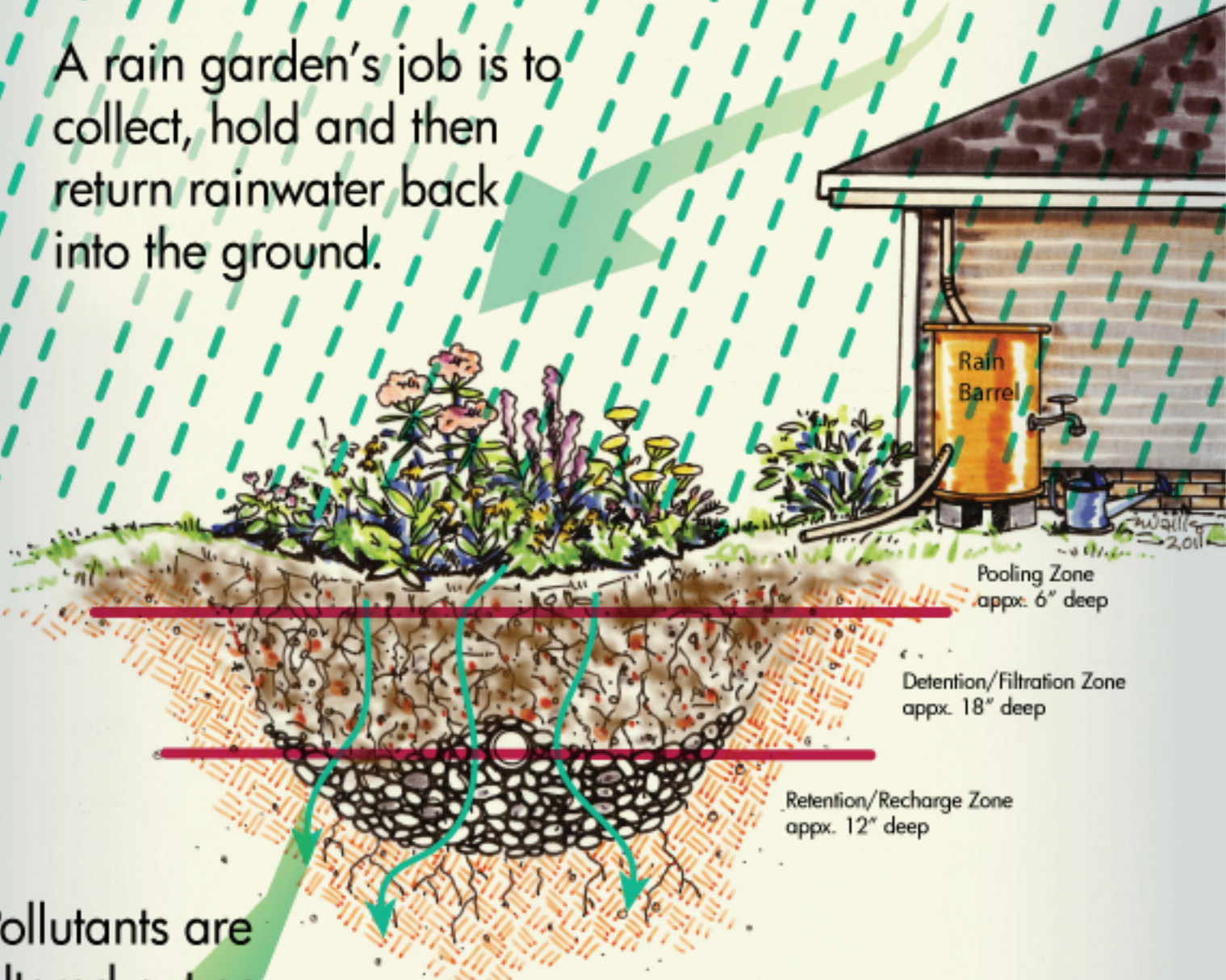


Rain Gardens

Pollutants are filtered out as water passes through rain gardens.

- To improve water quality
- To add beauty and habitat for birds and butterflies
